Pastor's Letter



Grace, Mercy and Peace to you and your family from our Creator, our Savior Jesus Christ, and our Sustainer the Holy Spirit!!

Last month I was excited to give you an update about our new ministry opportunity around leasing our property. This week I want to look back at the Indiana Kentucky Synod Assembly that Scott, Sandra (Vana), Missy and I attended in June. The 37th Annual Assembly of the Indiana-Kentucky Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America was held Friday, June 7, through Sunday, June 9, 2024, at the Crowne Plaza, in Louisville, KY.

In Romans Chapter 12:4-5, we read

“⁴ For as in one body we have many members and not all the members have the same function, ⁵ so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another.”

It is great to see the one body of Christ come together with its many gifts. The Synod Assembly brings together the 171 ELCA Congregations and Ministries from Indiana and Kentucky. It is a time we get to visit with our fellow Lutherans of our synod and see the whole of our synod, as we learn and work together for the betterment of God’s kin-dom. Each congregation is invited to send their rostered leaders and two representatives from their church. Larger churches are allowed to bring more representatives and congregations of diverse communities can bring additional representatives of those diverse communities. (Which is an overview of the weekends business) <https://iksynod.org/wp-content/uploads/2024/05/2024-Bulletin-of-Report.pdf-REDUCED.pdf> The attendance of the voting members was 196 lay members and 129 rostered leaders, 325 voting member in all. The assembly also allows visitors and non-voting members, such as visiting speakers, bishops, and helpers.

The Synod Assembly is much like the annual congregational meetings we hold at OSLC. There are many administrative acts to complete such as approving a new budget, hearing reports from the Synod Staff, electing Synod Council member, electing representative (one of which will be OSLC/PLM’s own Zach Echart) to go to the Churchwide Assembly (which will be held Aug 2nd, 2025, in Phoenix, AZ), and this year’s highlight of electing a new Bishop. (Bishop elections happen every 6 years.) As I have said publicly, our Bishop-elect is Pr. Tim Graham of Messiah LC in Fort Wayne, IN.

Some of my personal favorite parts of the Assembly are participating in the rich and remarkable worship, along with hearing awesome preaching. This year was exceptional as we heard from our current Bishop Bill and Bishop of the North/West Lower Michigan Synod, Bishop Craig Satterlee. Another favorite of mine is visiting with old and new friends of the Synod.

If you are ever interested in being a representative of OSLC to the Assembly, please let me know and we will give your name to the Nominating Team for our next congregational meeting in January.

Thank you for your partnership in ministry. You are a blessing from God, a blessing to OSLC, PLM and to me.

Second Quarter Financial Report

For the first six months of 2024, the church received \$177,390.59 in contributions and spent \$169,181.77 on expenses. Offerings for the first six months were 109% of our projected income.

In addition, we have received \$182,512.35 of the \$181,140 that has been pledged for the Capital Campaign. Several members who did not pledge at the beginning of the Capital Campaign have nonetheless made contributions which is why we have exceeded the pledged amount. The amount that has been pledged but not yet received, and any additional contributions will be used to reduce the principal on the MIF loan for the rental houses. These principal reduction payments will be very helpful when the interest rate on this loan readjusts in September of 2027.

Ministry Team Chairs/ Teams: *Remember to discuss your annual budget requests and prepare to send them to Steve Belter for budget planning by September 10th.* During September and October, the Financial Team will need those requests as the stewardship process begins to budget for 2025.

Please think big and dream bigger as we share the God's Kin-dom with others.

This doesn't mean Spend, Spend, \$pend... But, rather, look at each budget line item prayerfully. Are the funds being used, or are they used for the betterment of God's work? If not, maybe we can let that line item go. If there are funds sitting dormant because we don't have that specific need anymore, maybe those funds can be allocated elsewhere. Finally, if there is something you or your team believes God is calling us to do as the Body of Christ, request the funds you need to make it happen and happen well.

All OSLC Members: The Stewardship Team will soon work on the information for the Stewardship packages. These packages will include the proposed 2025 budget, a stewardship prayer, an invitation to prayerfully discern your financial contribution to support God's mission through OSLC in 2025, and other info. **Stewardship packages will be available to pick up at church, on Sunday Sept 29th.** If you are not available to pick them up, we will mail out what remains on September 30th. Pledge (Commitment) Sunday, when we invite you to return those pledges, will be Sunday October 20th. You may place them in the offering plate prior to that Sunday or mail them using the included envelope, whenever they are ready.

Because of your generous sharing, OSLC and PLM continue in God's call and ministry.

Thank you for all you do and your continued support of loving and serving God and neighbor. You are worthy, appreciated, and loved.

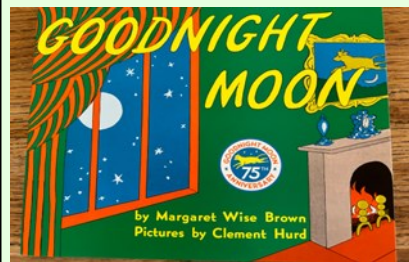


Faith Formation August News



Godly Play Invitation-

This Fall, we are experimenting with a new Sunday School method called Godly Play. Many of you experienced Godly Play in June when Carol and Missy held a Godly Play session during the Adult Forum. We witnessed how the kids engaged with the story and the materials. Play-based storytelling is a powerful way of passing on our faith stories to the children at OSLC. We have been working to pull the stories together this summer and prepare the room for Godly Play this Fall. Please take a moment to read this heartfelt message from Carol and consider if you would be interested.



I love everything about storytelling. I love the stories and the messages. I love the familiarity and comfort of sharing time and space with important people. I love that the essence of those moments stays with me forever as part of my very being. When Meghan was little, a precious, awe-inspiring life truth was born deep in me. I discovered the power and the joy of

storytelling in the experience of rocking a new baby in a quiet, cozy room and reading treasured stories like "Goodnight Moon" by Margaret Wise Brown. Meghan was snuggled in warm blankets made by women of her family who gifted her with these reminders of her heritage and the legacy of ancestors who came before her. As she cuddled her Winnie the Pooh bear, the rhythm of the rocking chair and the rhythm of the words in the book soothed my baby and my soul. Repeatedly reading those loved stories built a bridge that spans time and space. Sometimes, we end our calls with the phrase, "Goodnight, moon!" Storytelling is powerful and is our lifeline to those who came before us and still influence us. I am so excited about participating in Godly Play because it takes me right back to my own family stories. I am ready to try my hand at sharing the stories of God and God's people with the youth of OSLC.

Carol and I will hold Godly Play-based training for those interested in being storytellers on **August 18th and August 25th after the 9:00 am worship** service in our newly updated Sunday School Room. We will walk you through everything you will need to be a storyteller. We hope to have 3-5 storytellers so people have an opportunity to participate, but it is only an occasional Sunday commitment. We have all the stories planned out for the 2024/2025 year, so you will know the story you are telling well in advance and become familiar with it.

We also need door greeters/ helpers in the classroom. This person is the second adult in the classroom and helps prepare the children to get ready and enter the classroom. They also help them with their exploration (play) and art time. We recommend attending one of the training dates if you want to be a door greeter.

Another exciting announcement is that Kathy Heise will facilitate a music time with the children on the first Sunday of every month! Music and song are intricate ways people learn about and express their faith. We will update the preschool Sunday School room to accommodate the music time. We are so grateful for this opportunity for our children.

Other news for Faith Formation: Holly Black is interested in reigniting the Book Club and Hearts & Crafts this Fall. Both will begin in September. Book Club will read three books this Fall and meet via Zoom once in September, October, and November. The September book is "Winter Garden" by Kristin Hannah. Hearts and Crafts will begin on Tuesday, September 10th, at 1:30 in Fellowship Hall. We will start with easy card making, and you can bring a craft to work on. 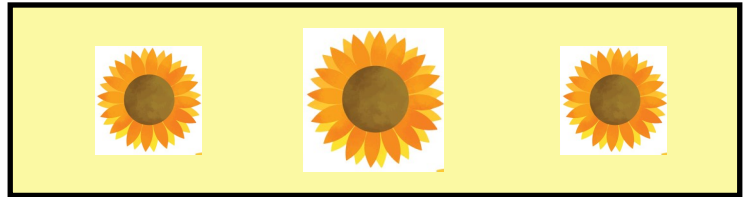
One final announcement-

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

Include the Following in each School Kit

- ◆ Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 1/2"; no loose leaf paper
- ◆ One 30-centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ◆ One pencil sharpener
- ◆ One pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- ◆ Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- ◆ Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- ◆ One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- ◆ One 2 1/2" eraser

Welcome Back, Purdue!

As West Lafayette gets re-populated with new and returning students, we pray for the transition into this new academic year. Many students will join OSLC for worship throughout the year, and here's a couple of things *you* can do to help them feel celebrated as part of our community:

Wear a Name Tag – Every week we have a table of sticker name tags available, and you can opt to use one with or without your pronouns. When we all wear name tags as often as we can, no one feels left out or different when they are our guests.

Introduce Yourself...Often! – Before and after worship is a great time to engage with students or guests with whom you may not be familiar. As a returning member of the community, you are the best and most qualified to say “Hi! My name is...what’s yours?” And yes, do this even when you’re wearing a name tag.

Take Notice – Yes, we love to see one another each week. And we can be just as excited to notice someone unfamiliar. Say Hi! Sit with them or invite them to sit with you. Let them know where the bathrooms are, ask if they are familiar with the worship service; and if they’re not, let them know a little bit of what to expect based on your experiences. And when you see that new face return for another week, lather, rinse, and repeat. Say hi, sit with them, and engage in conversation.

When we do these things each and every week, we may find ourselves becoming acquainted with one another in surprising and new ways. Wouldn't it be great if every guest, every student, every person who worshipped with us felt seen, loved, and celebrated as part of our community? No matter the frequency, we have an incredible opportunity to be agents and witnesses of God's love to strangers and friends alike in ways that might make a difference, often beyond our own comprehending.

Remember that you are celebrated in this community, too, and are just as important and valuable. When we know we are loved, we can love others with even more courage and curiosity.

You don't have to visit the beach to make a sandcastle. Make fluffy "moon sand" to build fun structures.

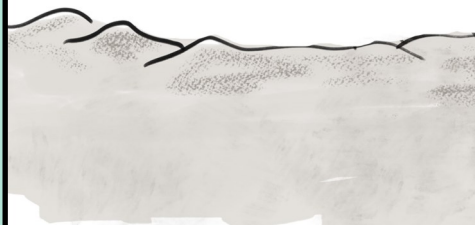
What you need:
