## The Best Gift for Your Pastor

October is Pastor Appreciation Month—a time to recognize and encourage those who faithfully shepherd our churches. But if you've ever asked a pastor how to show your gratitude, the answer probably isn't a plaque or applause. More often than not, it's simple: "Pray for me."

Even the Apostle Paul didn't ask for much personally, except for the prayers of fellow believers. In his letter to the Romans, he wrote: "Now I urge you, brothers and sisters, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the love of the Spirit, to strive together with me in your prayers to God for me, that I may be rescued from those who are disobedient in Judea, and that my service for Jerusalem may prove acceptable to the saints; so that I may come to you in joy by the will of God and relax in your company" (Romans 15:30–32, NASB).

This October—and every month—encourage your pastor by offering your prayers, support, and kind words. Ministry can be demanding, but knowing the church is lifting them up makes all the difference.



## Pastor's Letter



### “Open Hands, Open Hearts”

Dear Beloved of God,

This fall, Our Saviour Lutheran Church enters a season of prayerful stewardship along with our faithful discernment. Stewardship is more than a financial campaign; it is our response to God’s overflowing love. It is the practice of recognizing that all we have—our time, our abilities, our resources, even our land—is gift. In gratitude, we place these gifts back into God’s hands for the sake of the gospel and for the good of our neighbors.



In our August sermons, we were reminded that God’s call is not about clinging to possessions or anxieties, but about trust. Jesus told his disciples, “Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father’s good pleasure to give you the kingdom.” That kingdom vision is not abstract; it takes root in how we live, how we share, and how we use what God has entrusted to us.

At OSLC, that kingdom call is taking shape in a particular way this year: our discernment about how best to use our property. We are asking questions not just about buildings or budgets, but about mission. Could this land support affordable housing for our community? Could it provide space for childcare, helping families who struggle with cost and availability? These are not easy questions, but they are faithful ones. They invite us to see beyond our own comfort, and to imagine how God’s love can ripple out through us in new and unexpected ways.



This is where stewardship and discernment come together. Both require us to hold our lives with open hands, trusting that God is at work in ways larger than we can see. Both call us to generosity—not only in what we give financially, but in how we share our imaginations, our prayers, our skills, and our willingness to follow where God leads.

As we move toward Pledge Sunday on October 19, I invite you to consider not simply *how much* to give, but *why* we give. We give because God first gave to us. We give because the church is a community where lives are changed and hope is born. We give because, together, we are stewards of a mission far greater than ourselves.

In the coming weeks, you will hear stories of how your gifts sustain worship, support ministries of care, and help us lean into bold possibilities for our property. You will be invited to pray, to listen, and to respond. Your pledge—of finances, of time, of presence—makes a difference. It is a witness of trust in God’s promises, and a building block for the ministry God is shaping through OSLC.

This is an exciting and challenging time in our life together. Thank you for the generosity you already live out in countless ways. Thank you for leaning into God’s future with hope. And thank you for being part of this community where we continue to discover, again and again, that Love wins. God wins.

## Volunteer Opportunity



If you're looking for a way to assist your church and you're comfortable with basic finances, this opportunity may be right for you.

### **OSLC is seeking a volunteer to become Financial Secretary for the congregation.**

The primary responsibility of the OSLC Financial Secretary (FS) is to maintain records of pledges and contributions to the church. This is done by making entries into the church's database each week (usually less than an hour each week), using the counters' report created by the members who count the weekly offering.

Each month the FS generates a report of income, including income reported by our online giving provider, and works with the Treasurer and the Funds Treasurer to verify that reported amounts match their records. The FS provides this report to the Finance Ministry Team and participates in their monthly meetings. The Finance Ministry Team provides support to and answers questions from the FS.

At the end of each quarter, the FS prints a report of each member contributions and distributes these statements of giving to the members.

At the end of each year the FS projects the income for the coming year based on pledges, past giving patterns, and other sources of income. This estimate is important input for preparation of the church budget and is provided as part of the Annual Report.

The FS also responds to member queries about their contributions and other related matters.






