A Day to Honor Our Veterans

On November 11, 1918, the Germans and the Allied Nations, which included the United States, signed a document to initiate an armistice (cessation of hostilities), thus ending World War I. A year later, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation designating November 11 as Armistice Day. It was to be a day of reflection — a day to remember those who died in the country's service and to offer Americans the opportunity "to show sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nation."

Wanting to recognize more specifically America's veterans, Congress passed a bill changing the name of the day from Armistice Day to Veterans Day. The change was made in May 1954.

On this national holiday, churches around the nation hold services of prayers and praise. Followers of the Prince of Peace pray for peace among the nations of Earth and for the day when "they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more" (Isaiah 2:4, NRSV).

Finding God in the Familiar

Dear friends in Christ,

I'm grateful and excited to share that Our Saviour Lutheran Church has been awarded a **\$59,954 Clergy Renewal Grant** from the **Lilly Endowment Inc.**, administered through **Christian Theological Seminary** in Indianapolis. OSLC is one of 200 congregations across the country selected for this program in 2025! This generous grant will allow me to take a **Clergy Renewal Leave from April through July 2026** under the theme "*Finding God in the Familiar*," inspired by *Ecclesiastes 3:1–8*: "*For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven.*"

This time away will provide an opportunity for rest, reflection, and renewal—for me, for my family, and for our congregation. After nearly thirteen years of ministry, 6 of them with you as of Dec 1st, I look forward to stepping back to renew my spirit and reconnect with the core relationships and passions that sustain my call: faith, family, friends, and creativity.

During the sabbatical, scheduled for March 30th through July 13th, I will engage in **four main experiences**, each a way of rediscovering God's presence in ordinary life:

- **Photography – a time to embrace:** Learning to see and capture the sacred in everyday life through photography lessons and practice.
- **Faith – a time to seek:** Traveling with my wife, Missy, to Germany to explore the roots of our Lutheran faith and reflect on how the Reformation continues to shape our ministry today. (In June)
- **Family – a time to gather stones:** Traveling with our children to Florida for a long-awaited family renewal trip, reconnecting and celebrating time together as adults. (Late April or Early May)
- **Friends – a time to dance:** Reuniting with lifelong friends at the NCAA Basketball Tournament's Final Four, rekindling relationships that have supported me since before seminary. (April 4-6th) And due to scheduling conflicts, a short trip to Nashville TN, to for those who cannot make the Final Four Trip. (date TBD)

While I'm away, **OSLC will also enter its own season of renewal.** The grant includes support for pastoral leadership and opportunities for our congregation to grow in faith and fellowship:

- Hosting **house gatherings** during the NCAA Tournament for fun, community, and charity.
- Holding a **church reunion** to reconnect with past members and celebrate OSLC's story.
- Welcoming **guest preachers** from my Wabash Pastoral Leadership cohort, area pastors, and Pastor Kristin Rice, who will continue preaching and pastoral care.
- Learning together about our **Lutheran heritage** through presentations led by Rev. Dr. Derek Nelson of Wabash College, connecting to the Germany pilgrimage.



Pastor's Letter Continued

The Lilly Endowment's Clergy Renewal Program honors pastors and congregations with time to rest, reflect, and be refreshed. As Dr. Robert Saler, the program's director, notes, these sabbaticals help pastors and congregations "actively invest in what reenergizes their leaders for long-term ministry."

This renewal leave comes at a meaningful time for OSLC. As our congregation continues discerning how to serve our community with faith and imagination, this sabbatical offers space for both pastor and congregation to listen for God's voice—trusting that the Spirit who has guided us so far will continue to lead us forward.

I am deeply grateful for your support and prayers through this process. I truly believe that this will be a **time of blessing for all of us**—a season to rest, rejoice, and find God again in the familiar places of our lives.

Advent Party and Cookie Exchange- December 7th, during the fellowship hour (10:15-11:15)





Third Quarter Financial Report

For the first nine months of 2025, the church received \$288,517.67 in contributions and spent \$258,001.42 on expenses. Offerings for the first nine months were 103% of our projected income.

Our Capital Campaign for the purchase of the rental apartments was structured to raise funds over three-years. That three-year period ended on June 30th although we will continue to accept contributions.

We have received \$204,588.44 towards the \$181,140 that was pledged for the Capital Campaign. Several members who did not pledge to the Capital Campaign have nonetheless made contributions and a few people have exceeded their pledges. Any additional contributions will be used to reduce the principal on the MIF loan for the rental houses. These principal reduction payments will be very helpful when the interest rate on this loan readjusts in September of 2027.

- **Breaking Bread:** Has continued to grow, averaging 12 participants on Wednesday evening—a 300% increase compared to previous Sunday evening gatherings.
- **New Business:** Sandra and Scott Vana have sold their house, and Sandra has moved to Kansas. She has resigned as President of the church council, and this year's nominating committee for new council representatives will need to be transferred.
- **Discernment Process:** Session for will take place on November 10th via Zoom at 6:30 PM, at Pints with the Pastor on November 11th at 6:30 PM at Nine Irish Brothers, and November 16th during Adult Forum.






OSLC Members and PLM Students are invited to participate in choir this fall.
